My Priority Factors: What Matters Most to Me?

Before you decide where to apply, it's important to consider what priority factors are most important to you. In other words, what do you need to have in a college?

You should never choose a college just based on its name, location, or reputation.

Think of buying a car. You wouldn't buy one based on the name alone. You would ask yourself: Is it safe? How many people does it seat? How many miles per gallon does it get? What features does it offer? What color do I want?

Below are some of the most common factors students consider when they decide where they want to apply with a list of specific questions to consider. As you read, think about which factors stand out to you as the most important.
